Cameron also gives presentations on the threats of today as well as solutions for tomorrow’s biggest security challenges for both security contractors and corporations alike.

Summary

Malwarebytes labs publishes quarterly reports covering the threat landscape – based on unique and proprietary research conducted by Malwarebytes researchers and analysts. This presentation will cover findings from the Q3 report.

Previously, in our Q2 2017 report the Malwarebytes team saw a significant shift in dominance of new threats and infection techniques from the first quarter of 2017. Some of the key takeaways from the Q2 2017 report included:

- Ransomware continued to dominate with the utilization of new techniques such as NotPetya and WanaCry**
- Exploit Kit and Malicious Spam (malspam) lead the way for distribution**
